# A Christian Response to Violence

## Tentative Schedule

The State of Wisconsin recently passed a law legalizing the concealed carrying of firearms. This law has generated much conversation in Milwaukee area churches as to what a Christian response should be. At the recent annual convention of the Episcopal Diocese of Milwaukee, a resolution passed urging all Episcopal churches in the diocese to post signs stating that concealed weapons would not be allowed on the premises.

We at All Saints' are not content to leave the dialogue there. We believe that the passing of this law begs larger questions:

1. Why are people so fearful that they feel a law like this needs to be passed?
2. What are the moral and ethical implications of being a Christian in a violent society?
3. How can we raise awareness about these issues and what is an appropriate call to action?

## 2012 – Exploring Causes of Violence

In order to look at these questions we are planning a year-long series of events including, but not limited to, workshops and lectures. At each of these events we will be looking at some aspect of violence, racism, or sociological factors that contribute to fear, which leads to injustice.

Our kickoff event will be held on Saturday, January 14, here at All Saints'. The morning will involve two workshops: one on racism and another on domestic violence. After lunch we would like to offer a series of shorter presentations from members of the community who deal with these issues. It is our hope that these same presenters can return later in the year to speak in more depth on either a weeknight or a Sunday morning. The day will end with an ecumenical prayer service for peace and justice – and this is where you come in.
