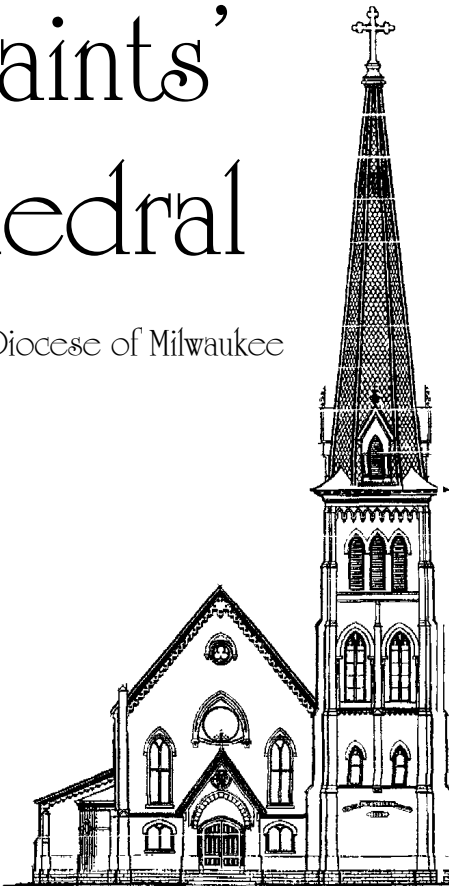

THE NEWALA COW PROJECT -- 4TH QUARTER OUTREACH



The Cathedral's 4th quarter Outreach Project is the Cow Project of St. Mary's Church, Newala, in southern Tanzania, East Africa. It is the home parish of Dr. Lawi and Molle Issa, who visited All Saints' last September. The Fellowship Group of St. Mary's has started a dairy cow project similar in design to the Heifer Project. They call it "Kopa Ng'ombe, Lipa Ng'ombe" - "Borrow a Cow, Pay a Cow." According to their proposal, of the 10,000 people of Newala, only about 5% have access to milk. Their goal is to increase the access to 20% by the year 2012. The 55 members have contributed \$576 themselves; this from individuals in a country where the average yearly income is only some \$200. Other donors (in our own midst) have funded the construction of the cow hut and the purchase of two cows. What remains is the purchase of more cows, at around \$500 each. Besides these costs, there is training from the Veterinary Officer from the District Council of Newala. But this project is off to a health start. It just needs more push!!
