We beseech thee to hear us, good Lord.

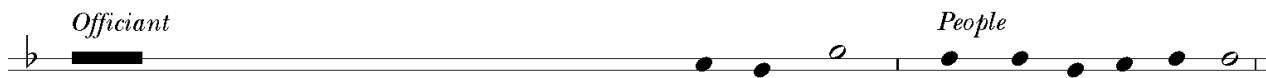
