Eucharistic Prayer B

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.





The Guest House of Milwaukee

Please join us on Wednesday, April 24th for the 2nd quarter "sandwich making" get-together to benefit The Guest House of Milwaukee. Our goal is to once again make 300 sandwiches!

For reference, The Guest House of Milwaukee serves more than 80 men at their homeless shelter and hundreds throughout the community experiencing homelessness, housing instability, and food insecurity. Volunteer opportunities with this organization include a meal program, a food donation drive, and a sandwich donation program.

Here at the Cathedral, we began a quarterly effort to help support their sandwich donation program. The Guest House provides approximately 200-400 sandwiches daily to shelter guests and to those in need in our community. Their goal is to have sandwiches available to all those in need each day of the year.

The Guest House provides detailed sandwich preparation guidelines for volunteer groups. This includes types of sandwiches which are allowed, estimated quantities of food needed, and labeling and storage requirements. We are welcome to make as many sandwiches as we are able in increments of 25 and up to 400 total.
